

Strings and Things Music Studio Policy

2021-2022

Attendance

Student and parent/guardian (if student is a minor) will attend lessons at the agreed upon day and time. Ms. Klopfenstein will send a complimentary reminder via text the day of lessons.

A parent/guardian (if student is a minor) must be present during the lesson (no drop-offs).

If unable to attend lessons, 24-hour notice is requested.

STMS does not give refunds for missed lessons. If advanced notice is given and another lesson time is available, Ms. Klopfenstein will offer you this space as a make-up but make-up lessons are not guaranteed. Please do your best to come during your scheduled lesson time.

If Ms. Klopfenstein has an emergency and is unable to attend a lesson, your lesson will be credited the following month.

Siblings are welcome to come to lessons but must not be a distraction. Please bring a quiet activity like homework, coloring book, or an iPad (please use headphones).

During the lesson, please refrain from eating food. Covered drinks are acceptable.

Please plan to arrive no earlier than 5 minutes before your scheduled lesson time. Enter quietly so as not to distract or interrupt the other student's lesson.

If Ms. Klopfenstein is coming to your home, please be sure that the lesson space is distraction free and contain any large dogs in a separate area.

COVID-19

Healthy students are encouraged to attend lessons at the music studio in order to receive the best possible instruction. However, if you have any symptoms or have been exposed to someone who tested positive for COVID 19, lessons may be conducted online via Zoom or FaceTime. Thank you!

Performances

There are two formal recitals per year, one in December and one in the May. Please make every effort to attend. Performance is an important part of being a musician and essential for personal growth and confidence.

There is a \$10 participation fee per student. Friends and family are welcome at no additional cost. Refreshments will be served following the performance. Beverages, plates, and napkins will be provided. Each family is asked to bring a snack or sweet treat to share.

Additional performance opportunities may be presented throughout the year. STMS is all about sharing music with the community. If you have an elderly loved one in a retirement facility, please let me know. Senior citizens are wonderful audiences and love interacting with children. (COVID-19 permitting)

COVID-19

STMS follows the CDC and state guidelines in regard to performances and gatherings. If unable to gather, performances will be recorded and submitted online, and participation fees would be waived.

Lesson Fees

Payments are withdrawn automatically on the 1st day of the month with the amount due for that month. A receipt for the transaction will be emailed or texted to your phone for your records.

30-minute lesson = \$27.50 45-minute lesson = \$41.25 60-minute lesson = \$55

If you live within a 10-mile radius of the studio, take a 60-minute lesson, and time permits, Ms. Klopfenstein may be able to come to your home for lessons. Please add \$10 driving fee per week (Example: \$55 plus \$10 driving fee = \$65)

Group Classes

In addition to private lessons, students may participate in a Group Class. Group Classes will be limited to 3-5 students, 45-minutes in length, and meet once a month on a Saturday morning. A participation fee of \$100 will be added to tuition the beginning of September for the Fall Semester. Group Class dates are: 9/11, 10/2, 11/6, 12/4.

Strumming Circle: 9-9:45 am (Guitar and ukulele Students)

Strings: 10-10:45 am (Violin and viola students)

Band: 11-11:45 am (All instruments welcome)

Student Expectations

Students will bring their instrument, music books, and a notebook to each lesson.

Students will do their best to stay focused, listen, and follow directions.

Students will set aside a time every day as “practice time.” Practice carefully and correctly.

Parent Expectations, Learning Plans, and Rewards

Ms. Klopfenstein works with the parent/guardian and student to create a learning plan that is tailored to each student’s age, ability level, learning style, and needs. Assignments for the week are written in the student’s notebook. A practice chart may be requested for added accountability and motivation.

Ms. Klopfenstein believes that the best reward for learning to play correctly is the satisfaction that you created beautiful music. However, she also has a bunch of fun stickers for students to collect as a reward for playing well and staying focused during lessons.

Parent/guardian of a young student, approximately 5-8, will need to help them practice correctly. Practice time will be brief due to their short attention span. Focus should be placed on correct repetition - 5 times a day - as opposed to how many minutes. That being said, a realistic goal is the student’s age, multiplied by 2. If you are not familiar with how to play the specific instrument they are learning or are unable to read music, remember, neither are they. Ms. Klopfenstein will help you and your student understand each week’s lesson and assignments.

Parent/guardians who are not able to be present at the lessons, please pass along this lesson policy to your son or daughter’s caregiver and be sure they are familiar with these expectations.

COVID-19 If learning online, please assist with set-up and be nearby should any issues arise. Please be sure your wifi connection is working properly as learning cannot happen without both audio and visual.
